BERLIN Four Power Conference -O-O-O-O-

The conference building - seat of the former Allied Control Council. (Nazi High Court and former royal palace - Soviets walked out in 1948)

First encounter between the Soviet and Western Foreign Ministers since 1949. In the meantime 21 diplomatic notes were exchanged.

On the opening day of the conference the people of Berlin thronged in the streets to witness the arrival of the Big Four.

The first to arrive is John Foster Dulles with the US delegation.

The USSR delegate drives through the British and American sectors to the conference building.

Then comes the French Foreign Secretary Bidault followed by Anthony Eden- the British Foreign Secretary.

The clock indicates the beginning of an historic meeting 15 hrs 20 min.

The delegates takes their seats. Left of the Americans the Russians and on the other side the French. The British are seated before the fireplace.

John Foster Dulles takes the chair for the first meeting- a meeting on which the hopes of the world center- will the conference inaugurate a new era of peace - will German unity be restored after nine years of division? Quo vadis. . .
