Sydney, Princess of the Pacific, awaits her Queen. Throughout the night a myriad light illuminate the streets in the most spectacular display in the city's history.

Spectators keep a night-long vigil, thousands taking up picked positions many hours before the Queen is due to pass by. So they wait,

enduring discomfort in happy anticipation of the great day.

Then morning ... and the Royal yacht "Gothic" steams towards Sydney Heads, shepherded by units of the Royal Australian Navy and Air force.

Her Majesty is following the course of pathfinder Captain Phillip, who, on hundred and sixty-six years ago, entered Port Jackson with the first fleet.

Sunshine and clear blue skies. Eafer trhongs crowd cantage points at the Harbour entrance to welcome the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh to Australia. The Gothic is a welcome visitor indeed as she makes her way majestically up the Harlour.
