Ski-Jumping - Sweden.

Down Kallvik Hill, Sweden's greatest ski-jump, speeds Salmenranta, a Finnish challenger, during an international meeting. Now for a Swedish champion, Evert Karlsson.

A magnificent jump of 237 feet!

Here's the favorite, Falkanger, a Norwegian: A perfect combination of skill, poise, and nerve, plus that extra something that makes a champion.

But it's not a good day for Falkanger. He's only managed 229 feet. Although it's literally freezing cold on Kallvik Hill, 60,000 people have gathered for the sport, for ski-ing is to the Swedes what football is to the English. This is the first time in living memory that there's been no wind to worry the skiers, so much is expected of American Wegeman who recently beat even the Swedish champions.

And that's another jump of 237 feet! As the tussle warms up, the crowd tries to do likewise. Meanwhile the almost legendary Pietikainen the world champion from Finland, goes into action. And a superb jump of 253 feet wins him the championship title.
