ALL BLACKS V. THE BARBARIANS.

A superb kick, clean over the bar. 5-3 now. Up to half-time there's no change in the score, but the All Blacks soon make it 5-8 in their favour, and full of confidence go after more. Dixon dives over the line, but he's not in the field of play. This is the turning point of the game.

Out of Scott who cuts through the defence like a knife. As he falls, he slips it to Jarden who carries it over.

Jarden takes the kick, and converts his own try. 5-13 now. But hardly have the crowds stopped cheering before young Maurice Dixon races through.

16-5 to the All Blacks! No conversion for that one. Only two minutes left, and Dixon passes to McCaw. As McCaw goes down, he slips it to White who dives over for yet another. With the final score at 19 points to 5, All Blacks, one of the finest and most popular teams ever to visit this country, end their triumphant tour.
