AUSTRALIAN FLOODS.

Work begins in Australian towns and villages along the New South Wales coast to clear the streets and to repair the damage caused by the remark floods. As the waters slowly recede, the full extent of the disaster becomes known. Hundreds of homes have been ruled, and damage is estimated at many millions of pounds. This house was super more than half a mile across the town of Lismere, in one of the bardest hit areas of all. 23 people are known to have died in the floods, but it is feared that more have yet to be found.

Thousands of cattle, have perished in districts famous for their farms produce. Fresh supplies of foodstuffs are rushed to feed those which are still alive. Severely damaged was Casino where a span of the bridge was swept away by a wall of water thirty feet high.

Already gangs of werkmen have begun temperary repairs.

The Queen and Prince Phillip stayed at this hotel in Lismere only ten days before the flood. Shepkeepers face their task with a smile as their salesgirls clean the damaged goeds, covered in mad and slime. Polluted by the river, all meat has had to be destroyed. More than a quarter of a million pounds, worth of food grain and anything contaminated are dumped in a local pit. Such is the devastation in the walks of the worst flood in the history of New South value.
