AGRICULTURAL SHOW KITUI.

An agricultural show, held at Kitui, about 80 miles from Nairobi, draws some of Kenya's finest livestock. This village is deep in the heart of the Wakamba Reserve, and the Colonial Secretary Mr. Oliver Lyttleton includes it on his itinerary during his investigations onto the Mau Mau situation. Mr. Lyttleton has just announced that a council of four will be set up in the next few weeks with the sole purpose of fighting the menace.

Mr. Lyttleton and his party watch a display by Wakamba bowmen. Men from this tribe make up more than a quarter of all the Kenya police, and have given fine service during the emergency.

The Colonial Secretary hands prizes to the winners of the contests. Awards include a new farm tool for planting maize.

Escorting Mr. Lyttleton are Field Marshal Sir John Harding and Sir Evelyn Baring, the Governor of Kenya. Now 10 different sub-tribes from the Wakamba Reserve combine in traditional dances to honour their guests.
