COMET III

The Count, Mark Three, the newest version of the world's most famous jet circreft, begins its trials. At De Havilland's headquarters in Hatfield, it has already undergone its first engine-tests. Next will comes it flying trials. Four Rolls Royce Aven engines, even more powerful than in the earlier Counts, will carry the airliner ever stages exceeding 2,600 miles. 58 first-class or 76 tourist-class passengers can be accommedated.

Although the Couet One is still grounded and the Couet Two has only made trials flights, De Havilland's hope their new airliner will go into service in about two years.
