PRINCESS MARGARET UNVEILS NAVAL  
WAR MEMORIAL AT PLYMOUTH.

To Plymouth Hoe, a site for centuries associated with British seamen, comes Princess Margaret to honour 15,600 men and women of the Commonwealth navies who died in the last war. A new garden has been added to a memorial which stands in tribute to the Navy's dead of the 1914-18 war. This garden is to be opened by the Princess.

Men of the Commonwealth Fleets stand guard by the memorial which towers above a statue of Sir Francis Drake. Now follows the ceremony of unveiling:

Below the obelisk come relatives of the fallen. Many have journeyed far to see Her Royal Highness unveil the plaques which record the names to their loved one - all of whom have no known grave but the sea.
