BERLIN RIOTS.

In West Berlin, 70,000 workers clash with police and troops as they try to attack small bands of Communist youths. The workers came to attend a parade outside the town hall to commemorate the first anniversary of the June 17th revolt in East Germany. Then the Communists began to chant Red Slogans, and the riot broke out. Police hustle away the ringleaders of both sides.

About 600 police are brought into action. During the struggle about 80 people are seriously injured. More than a hundred others receive medical attention. Unlike last year's revolt, there are no fatal casualties. After half an hour, when 46 people have been placed under arrest, the riot is finally quelled.
