QUEEN MOTHER IN DUNDEE.

Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother comes to Caird Hall in Dundee to receive the Freedom of the City. With Lord Provost William Hughes she prepares to enter the hall for the ceremony. In the brim of her hat, the Queen Mother wears a diamond Black Watch brooch, for Her Majesty is also to receive the City Freedom on behalf of the regiment, of which she is Colonel-in-Chief. 3,000 people are gathered in Caird Hall to watch the presentation. The Lord Provost thanks the Queen Mother for accepting the City Freedom and now presents her with the Burgess Ticket. Her Majesty also receives the burgess scroll which confers the Freedom upon the Black Watch.

The full ceremony ended, crowds hail the Queen Mother again as she leaves to take the salute at a march-past, during which men of the Black Watch will exercise the right which the Freedom confers upon them - namely to enter the City with bayonets fixed, drums beating and Colours flying.

Following behind the colours, come old comrades of the regiment.

The march-past ended, the Queen Mother prepares to leave Dundee and journey on to Dumfries.
