PEACE IN CHAPMALA

Corrying anti-Communist beamers, jubilant soldiers colours to victory following their two-week rewelt in Quatemala. Colonel Carles Armas, the rebel-leader, is embraced by some of his supporters who helped him everthrow the Red regime in Guatemala. At the Presidential Palace in San Salvader, behind guarded doors, the rebels and the anti-Red military junta ruling the country to negotiate peace.

Salvador's President, Oscar Oscario, acts as mediator in the talks. Arriving from Guatemala City is Colonel Elfogo Monson, head of the temporary junta. He has high hopes of becoming President of Guatemala — but so has Colonel Arms. Nevertheless, after 36 hours of argument, it is agreed that a new junta, including the two rivals, will be set up. Then, when the few Red outland who still menace the City have been quelled, free elections will again be held in Guatemala.
