PEACE IN GUATEMALA.

Carrying anti-Communist banners, jubilant soldiers celebrate victory following their two-week revolt in Guatemala. Colonel Carlos Armas, the rebel-leader, is embraced by some of his supporters who helped him overthrow the Red regime in Guatemala. At the Presidential Palace in San Salvador, behind guarded doors, the rebels and the anti-Red military junta ruling the country to negotiate peace.

Salvador's President, Oscar Guerio, acts as mediator in the talks. Arriving from Guatemala City is Colonel Elfege Monsen, head of the temporary junta. He has high hopes of becoming President of Guatemala - but so has Colonel Armas. Nevertheless, after 36 hours of argument, it is agreed that a new junta, including the two rivals, will be set up. Then, when the few Red outlaws who still menace the City have been quelled, free elections will again be held in Guatemala.
