Preceded by the county standard, Her Royal Highness Princess Margaret enters the gardens of Dalton Hall, near Beverley. About 4,500 East Riding Girl Guides and Brownies are holding their county rally here and Princess Margaret, the Chief Ranger of the British Commonwealth and Empire, is their most honoured guest.

Spelling out a message of welcome, the children begin their display. This includes a tent-pitching contest by Rangers and Cadets with teams from five Land Ranger companies, one Sea Ranger crew and one Cadet Company. One of the high-spots of the rally is a Pageant of East Riding occupations, past and present. Agriculture is the theme of the Howdenshire Division. A display by the Buckrose Division pays tribute to the lifeboatman.

West Hull, naturally enough, contributes a model trawler.

And now Princess Margaret meets members of the Rally Committee and other Girl Guides officials. Her Royal Highness present certificates to some of the girls before she leaves. During a short address to the huge assembly, the Princess says how much she has enjoyed her visit to the rally and sends her best wishes to all the Rangers and Guides and Brownies in East Yorkshire.
