One of the high-spets of the rally is a Pageant of East Rhding occupations, past and present. Agriculture is the theme of the Howdenshire Division. A display by the Buckrose Division pays tribute to the lifebeaturen.

West Hull, naturally enough, contributes a model trawler.

And now Princess Margaret meets members of the Rally Committee and other Girl Guides officials. Her Royal Highmens present certificates to some of the girls before she haves. During a short address to the hugh assembly, the Princess says how much she has emjoyed her visit to the rally and sends her best wishes to all the Rangers and Guidee and Brownies in East Torkshire.
