SUEZ TERMS AGREED.

Meeting pressmen from all over the world at the Officer's Club in Cairo is Major Salah Salem - the dancing Major - who is Egypt's Minister of National Guidance. On the roof of the Club, about a hundred reporters and cameramen are gathered to question Salem and his Prime Minister, Colonel Abdel Nasser. President Neguib, whose power has been greatly weakened by Nasser, is not even present. Questions put by the press are mainly on the Anglo-Egyptian talks about the Canal Zone problem - but the two leaders avoid entering into any controversy of the subject. Salem, Egypt's propaganda chief, and Nasser prefer to relate the progress of Egypt since Farouk was tumbled from his throne.

Nasser heads his country's delegation at the Canal Zone talks, and it is he who presides at the final meeting with Britain's representatives. At long-last agreement has been reached, and Mr. Head Britain's Secretary for War initials the document. The main clause of the agreement states that all our troops will have left Egypt within twenty months, and may only return if Egypt, any other Arab state, or Turkey, is attacked. This agreement will last for seven years. These terms have created some indignation in Britain; nevertheless, after a tense debate, the Government secured approval for their actions. The pact has put Colonel Nasser in an even more powerful position; though apparently he draws the line at idolatory by his followers.
