The Duke has invited Freddie Brown - a Captain of England; R.W.V. Robins - Middlesex & England; Dennis Compton - Middlesex & England who is in tremendous form this season; J.J. Warr - Middlesex & England; Hubert Doggart - Captain of Sussex - also represented England; S.C. Griffith - a Sussex Captain & England wicket keeper; Bill Voce - Nottingham & England; Robin Marler - Sussex - a Captain of Cambridge University and a possible to tour Australia; young Jimmy Parks of Sussex - a really stylish batsman and the most recently capped England player - considered the finest cover point in the country and a probable for the Australian tour; and Ken Suttle - Sussex - who toured with the M.C.C. in the West Indies last winter.

Canada will be chosen from -
H.B. Robinson (Captain); Vancouver and Ottawa. Right hand batsman and off spin bowler. Attended Oxford University 1947-48, playing against Cambridge both years. First Canadian to win a Blue for cricket. Captained Canada in representative series against M.C.C. in 1951.

THOMAS L. BRIERLEY. Vancouver B.C. Right hand batsman; wicket keeper; well known in England, having played for Glamorgan and Lancashire.

HARRY G. BULLEN Calgary, Alberta. Right hand batsman; played baseball for Brooklyn Dodgers. By nature a forcing batsman; Bullen is a brilliant field in any position.

E.H.M. BURN St. Catharines, Ontario. Right hand opening bat. Learned the game in England, and emigrated to Canada after the war.

F.J. CAMERON. London, Ontario. Right hand bat and off spin bowler; one of four members of the team who learned the game and earned their reputations in the West Indies; played for Jamaica in inter-island tournaments and toured India with West Indies side.

BRIAN CHRISTEN Toronto, Ontario. Left arm fast medium bowler.

A.S. HENDY Vancouver B.C. Left arm bowler and left hand bat; a mainstay of cricket in B.C. for over twenty years. By profession a Detective.

JOHN H. LUCAS Montreal, P.Q. Right hand bat and off spin bowler and exceptional close-in field; native of Barbados which he represented regularly.

H. PADMORE Montreal, P.Q. Right arm opening bowler; learned the game in the West Indies.

W.A. PERCIVAL Toronto, Ontario. Canada's leading wicket keeper and a useful forcing right hand bat.

E.N. QUINTELL Aged 21. Vancouver B.C. Bats and bowls right hand; a natural athlete proficient in cricket, baseball, tennis and rugby football.

T.M. RILSTONE Montreal, P.Q. Right arm leg break bowler, left hand bat Native of Australia.

PETER STEAD Vancouver B.C.

Right arm opening bowler; another product of Yorkshire cricket who emigrated to Vancouver from Leeds; has become recognized as one of the most promising opening bowlers in Canada.

K. B. TRESTRAIL Toronto, Ontario.

Right hand bat; has a distinguished record in West Indian cricket, having toured England with the West Indies side in 1950.
