HOME FROM GREENLAND.

For two years, the British North Greenland Expedition has lived in the ice-bound wilderness near Britannia Lake. But now, their work done, they prepare for the journey home. During the long, lonely months, the team has explored vast areas of uncharted land, amassing valuable scientific information about the nature of the Greenland ice-cap, and about the weather conditions that prevail so near the North Pole. Now R.A.F. Sunderlands are ready to fly them home to Britain.

And so to Pembroke Dock. The four flying-boats bring, not only the members of the Expedition, but much of their valuable scientific equipment. Admiral of the Fleet Sir Algernon Willis greets Commander Simpson, the team leader, as he comes ashore.

A team of huskies made the journey too. They are to travel on eventually to the Antarctic to induce new blood into the existing dog-teams there. Many members of the expedition are from the services; others are civilian scientists. Morale, they all agree, was exceptionally high. Seeing his baby daughter for the first time is Chief Petty Officer Edward Jones. Of the success of the expedition, Commander Simpson merely says "I'll leave that for others to judge".
