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SIR GORDON RICHARDS:

Some weeks ago Sir Gordon Richards left hospital where he had been confined to bed following an accident at Sandown Park. We now know that this accident ended his riding career sooner than he had planned. 26 times champion jockey it seemed that the Derby would never be among his victories. Then in Coronation year he rode Pina. What a race it was! Gordon kept his mount back until soon after Tattenham Corner. Only Shikampur was between him and his first ever Derby win - but Pina never faltered.

And then to complete this perfect day, Sir Gordon was received in the royal box. It seemed fitting in Coronation year that, if the Queen herself could not be the winning owner, then Gordon should be the winning jockey. Later, at Buckingham Palace, came the climax to his career - a knighthood: a fitting tribute, not only to the skill that had made him the greatest jockey of all time, but to the sportsmanship that he had shown during his 34 years of riding.

Now at West Worthing, Sir Gordon is recuperating from his injury before he begins his new career as a trainer. The Pathe News reporter secured an exclusive interview with Sir Gordon who, although not fully recovered from his fall, says he is getting along fine. Sir Gordon looks back over the years - the the 4,875 winners he rode in that time.

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
