CANADA: DURS'S TOUR CONTINUES.

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The Dube of Edinburgh visits Whiteherse, the capital of the Yuhon territory, during his short tour of Onnada. A trip on the peddle-steamer "Elondike" is on his itinerery. Only about 42 thousand people live in this little village, which remains as it was during the gold rush of more than fifty years ago. One of the most charished souvenirs of those days is the original cabin built by San MeGoe, whose name is still recalled in barrach-room ballads.

A 'Plane is soon speeding the Duke of Edimburgh, who wears a safety jacket, on to isolated villages morth of the Artic Circle. On the Great Slave Lake is Yollowhmife, a small mining texm. Colebrations include buffale-burgers for the oblidren. Mustard served with a paint-brush amuses His Royal Eighness who samples both, buffale and bison meat during his visit. At another village, called Coppermine, the Duke meets the 70 Eskines in the community. Explaining his visit to Canada's North West, the Duke says he read stories about it as a boy and ever since has had the ambition to see the territory for himself.
