QUEEN MOTHER IN SCOTLAND

Unveiling Memorial Window to 4 Scottish Divisions.

Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother, accompanied by Dr. A.N. Davidson, Chaplain to the Queen in Scotland, and Minister of Glasgow, attends a Service of Commemoration at Glasgow Cathedral, prelude to the unveiling of a stained glass window in memory of the Officers and men of the Four Scottish Divisions who lost their lives in both world wars.

A prayer of Intercession was offered by the Assistant Chaplain-General, shortly after which the Queen Mother walks towards the window.

Now, in company with the Minister and Lieutenant General Sir Colin Barber, she watches the unveiling. The window (which is the work of Mr. Gordon Webster) shows the figures of St. Michael and St. Andrew flanked by the battle honours of the four divisions. It was a moving tribute to men long gone but in the words of the Anthem sung at the Service: "The souls of the righteous are in the hands of God, and there shall no torment touch them. In the sight of the unwise they seemed to die but they are in peace".
