The window (which is the work of Mr. Gordon Webster) shows the figures of St. Michael and St. Andrew flanked by the battle benours of the four divisions. It was a naving tribute to men long gone but in the words of the Anthen sung at the Service: "The souls of the righeous are in the hands of God, and there shall no terment touch them. In the sight of the unwise they seemed to die but they are in peace",
