RESCUE WORK AND FURERALS OF FIRST FOUND VICTIMS OF ALGERIA HARTHQUAKE Positive developed : 202xmetherexex 575xfbx 83 meters = 275bft Also covered by Fox and Universal and Paramount

The earth was still treabling yesterday in Orleansville, more than 24 hours after the disastrous earthquake that killed more than 1000 persons, Europeans and Algorians. Another 2000 were reporter injured, but the exact number of victims is still uncknown as many may still lie under the ruins of the city and surrounding towns and villages.

Quakes less violent that the first hit five times last night and in the morning. One of them lasted several seconds, bringing down unsteady houses and great pieces of already shattered malls. Damaged buildings in the city were sent erunbling into the streets.

There were 2000 rescue workers on the spot. The French Army and animalances also sent detachments of four bulldozers and big water tanks with bread and other food 50 field kitchens and cooks to man them.

An airlift organized between "Gricansville and Algiers took the most badly injured to helpitals in Algiers.

The first European and Algerian victims were immediately buried because of the extreme heat. Collective funerals were made in a most coremony and Service said by Monsignor DUVAL Archbishop of Algiers. And even during the funeral coremony more deads were brought in to be buried with the others.

Mr.Fmageis MITTERAMD, French Minister of Interior, accompanied by Governor General of Algeria, Mr.Leemard, the Profect of Algiers and other prominent officials both European and Algerian, arrived at the Under-Profecture at Orléansville; Led by Mr.BISCAMBIGLICE, Mayor of the destroyed term, they visited the ruins and wounded in Orléansville.

The Minister and his party assisted at a global service for all victims of the carthquake, Europeans and Mealens, in the Public gardens of Griéansville. A service was said by Measignor DEVAL Archbishep of Algiers, for the enthalies, while prayers were said by the Mufti of Griéansville for the Mahametans, andaRabbi prayed for the jew victims. This day, over 1500 deads have been identified, and over 5000 wounded are under treatment.

Immediately aftermards, continuing his tour of the damaged area, Mr.Mitterand and his party went over to Douar Beni Rached, 30 Kilemeters away from Orléansville, in the mountains. This small village who counted 550 inhabitants, has 307 deads, and all the other persons present in the village are more or less seriously wounded. Among the victims this one month old baby who lies with his leg broken and badly infested sounds. Mr.Mitterand immediately gave orders for the baby to be taken to a hospital in Algiers by an Helicopter and personnaly supervised the departure of the tiny victim.

An US.Army Helicopter from the Moroccan base of Sidi Slimme has been helping in transportation of the more badly wounded victims from villages in the mountain to Algiers hespital, and making countless round trips to and fro.

Back in Orléansville, Mr.Mitterand personnaly supervised distributions of food to the homeless, and was loudly cheered by the crowd of these poor people who wanted to express their gratitude to France's help in the person of the Minister.
