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MONZA - DUKE WINS GRAND PRIX.

Fergus Anderson and Ray Amm are the first away at the start of the 350 c.c., race during the Italian Grand Prix held at Monza, near Milan. Ken Kavanagh, number 18, quickly takes the lead on his Gussi. Lorenzetti and Anderson, two team-mates, are up with him, and the 24 lap race soon becomes a fight between the three of them. First one across the line is Anderson whose speed of 101.64 miles an hour sets a new record. A great victory for the Surrey-born rider.

Top event of the day is the 500 c.c. race with Geoff Duke the obvious favourite. Duke, the world champion, faces 28 rivals in this 125 mile race. Nearly all the entrants have adopted streamlining shells for their machines, including Duke in his Gilera. Right from the word "go" Duke, number six, is in the lead.

Masetti, Bandirela and Dale are Duke's nearest rivals. Number sixty, Montanari, leaves the road, but there's no great damage done.

Duke's still in the lead, lapping most of his rivals. Taking it easy, in he comes to score a resounding victory. Duke's lap record of 113.4 miles an hour and his winning speed of 111.46 miles an hour are the fastest-ever in a "classic" motor cycle race.



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
