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COPENHAGEN - TUG SINKS - 2 DIE.

In Copenhaven Harbour, at the mouth of the Elbe, Europe's biggest salvage boat the Ansdauer helps in the task of raising the tug "Fairplay the First" which sank after collision with the liner "Italia". Fairplay was towing the liner into port when the accident occurred. Italia's bows struck the tug near the stern and Fairplay sank within minutes. Fifteen members of the crew and three women visitors leapt clear and were picked up later, but the radio operator who was trapped for a time in a water-tight cabin, tapped messages to rescue parties. Then the tug sank, and all hope was abandoned.

The body of the Captain's son, Werner Reese, is lifted onto the deck as pumping operations continue. The "Fairplay" sank in only 40 feet of water, but immediate salvage was impossible. A tarpaulin covers the two victims. Now a full enquiry into the tragedy has been ordered.

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
