OLYMPIC HORSE TRIALS:

Harewood House, the Yorkshire home of the Princess Royal and the Earl and Countess of Harewood provides a gracious setting for the annual three-day horse trials. This is Major Weldon, the captain of the British Team which shortly will be competing at Basle in the 1954 European Championships.

The Princess Royal braces a cold wind to watch the riding. The quarry is one of the many obstacles. Each contestant has to ride about 17 1/2 miles during the trials. Mr. Ian Dudgeon takes Charleville over the steps. Apart from the selection of a team for Basle, the tests aim to groom riders for the next Olympic Games. Out of the Dragon's Lair comes Epijans with Captain Frisby in the saddle. The whole of the British team for Basle jump the course well, and four of them have completely clear runs.
