Airborne- commemoration at Arnhem, and Nijmegen . Length: 512 Metres.

10 years ago, on September 17th 1944, the Airborne landing at the Rhine near Arnhem took place.

The struggle of the British Airborne troops was commemorated this year with great dignity.

Pilgrims from Bristains came to Arnhem as usually, to assist at the ceremonies.

In the morning the service was held at the Airborne cemetery at Oosterbeek, where the dead are buried.

During the ceremony wreaths were placed at the monument, and school-children laid flowers at the graves (see further shotlist)

In the afternoon a silent procession proceeded through the streets of Arnhem to the simple monument in the vicinity of the Rhine-bridge. Relatives also laid flowers here (see further shot-list)

On the same day the people of Mijmegen commemorated their liberation. In the neighbourhood of the huge bridge over the river Waal, which was saved by a young Dutch resistance movement-men, Jan van Hoof, a monument was unveiled in his honour (see shot list) Afterwards there was a manmarch past in which British, Canadian, American

and Dutch troops took part (see shotlist) The monument shows Jan van Hoof running back to tewn, after he had demolished the blasting-charge which the Germans had put inder the bridge, holding above his head triumphantly the flag, and symbol of liberty.

The story is uncut and roughly mounted.
