HOLLAND'S WOBST POST-WAR FIRE.

Two hugh warehouses at Zasadan, just North of Ansterdan, blass for several hours. Five cities answer the call for aid, and 150 firemen are rushed to the spot. 40 jets heep the fire from spreading to ather dockside buildings. The two warehouses, called "Caar Peter" and "Nederland", contained large quantities of paints, eils and fabs and timber. A signette end is thought to have caused the blass.

As the buildings crumble, wast stores of melted cocco-butter flow out into the river gass. Despite all the firemen's efforts, the blase which is the worst Holland has suffered since the war, desults in damage estimated at more than a million pounds.
