MOTOR SHOW :

The 39th International Notor Exhibition opens at Harl's Court. Next two new additions to the Austin family. The Westminster on the right; and the Cambridge, a handsome four-door saleen.

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The Westminster replaces the Hereford and costs about fifty pounds loss, in other words about £790. Now the De Lume Hillmon Minz with the new everhead short stroke engine. Its price, including purchase tax is £681.

About forty brand-new models are on show including the Jensen 541, which has all-plastic body, and can clock a good hundred miles an hour. On now to the Lanchestor Sprite, the first British car to do away with gear changing. There's a selector lover on the steering column, and two control pedals. The Morris Oxford Traveller priced at £822 is the latest thing in shooting-brakes. The interior can quickly become a flat-floored leading bay.

The Marcedes 300 2 seatur coupe is one of the German exhibits, Points of appeal include the petrol injection engine, and a top goar that can cope with a fifteen mile an hour crawl or top the 165 mile an hour mark.

Note the adjustable steering-wheel. Coming back to Britain again here's the Rolls Royce Silver Wraith, perhaps the most graceful and precisionbuilt car in the show - its price? a more \$7034.
