SCOTLAND V. WALES:

Scotland and Wales take the field together at Ninian Park, Cardiff for their traditional annual duel that draws 60,000 fans. The home team kick-off and straightaway they're on the attack.

Trever Ford, number nine, clashes with George Young, the Scots captain, and it's a corner. Outside-left Roy Clarke takes it for Wales. Young Derek Tapscott and goalie Willie Fraser fight it out. Fraser is making his international debut in this match. Now it's the turn of Willie Waddell who baffles the Welsh defence as he hustles upfield.

And an anxious moment, but Alf Sherwood kicks it behind. Nearly a goal that time. And the Scotsmen don't let the Welsh defenders relax.

And again it's Alf Sherwood who saves the Welsh bacon.

Scotland sweep back once more. Ring centres, but Buckley doesn't connect. Another lucky escape. With Scotland taking most of the honours, half-time comes, around. There's still no score so Wales set out to do something about it.

Tapscott, the young Arsenal inside-right, centres. Davidson, who's playing a great game, helped avert that spot of trouble. But here comes some more. This time Cunningham deals with it by flicking back to the goalie.

Scotsman Ring takes over. Last season he was top scorer for Clyde, and this is his international debut. Ring comes back into the picture as he centres. Goalie Kelvey can't reach it, and Paddy Buckley is there to head it into the Welsh net!

With Scotland leading one-nil, Wales go all out for equaliser. John Charles, number 5 puts in good service at centre-half, but with only a few minutes left to play, he's moved up to centre-forward. But the Welshmen, who'd hoped this year to gain their first post-war win at Ninian Park didn't pull the game out of the fire. Scotland win by one goal to nil.
