HURRICANE KILLS 160.

For eighteen hours, the coast of South Carolina is swept by a tempestuous hurricane nicknamed Hazel. Continuing its journey from the Caribbean, it moves on into Toronto. Fifteen hundred people are made homeless in the province of Ontario where the death-roll reaches 85. The raging floodwaters strand a farmer in a tree. Rescuers try desperately to reach him. Finally, suffering from exposure, he is brought to safety.

Hurricane Hazel, the latest of many to hit the Atlantic Coast, causes fearful damage in Canada. Estimates put it as high as 30 millions pounds. During its week-long rampage the hurricane is responsible for at least 160 deaths in America and Canada. Toronto is almost cut off from its suburbs, and forty bridges on the town's outskirts are smashed. Hurricane Hazel is Ontario's worst storm within living memory.
