At that time the Boys Brigade had recently been formed, and Colonel Goldsmid was invited to attend a display in Cardiff. So enthusiastic was he with what he saw, that he determined to found a Brigade for Jewish Boys, and with that end in view he put that proposition before the Maccabean Society who heartily endorsed his suggestion. In October 1394, the first company of the Jewish Lads Brigade was founded at the Free School.....

COMPERE... The religious side of Brigade life is never forgotten. Chanukah, the feast of lights, which so typifies the spirit of the Jew and therefore of the Brigade, will be celebrated in a few weeks time. Here then in representation, is the lighting of the candles, a ceremony to be repeated in homes and synagogues throughout the world.

CAMP TREK

COMPERE: .. One of the main activities of Brigade life - I might almost by THE main - and to which boys most look forward, is the annual summer camp. May years ago, when transport was not as efficient as it is now, and the youth Eastern and Chatham Railway slowly served the silvery seaside, the Brigade produced a squad who marched from London to Deal for their summer camp - it took then three days. MASS PHYSICAL TRAINING

COMPERE...At the annual 'Open' Day of camp, one of the most spectacular sights is the mass physical training in which boys are brought together from all over London and the provinces for this special occasion and in ten days are welded into a team. In presenting a similar item tonight, we have brought together boys from all over London, whose training has originated on Company parades and who are being welded together 'before your very eyes'.

HANDBALL

COMPERE...It mustn't be thought that camp life is all training and discipline. Time off for recreation 4% One of the most popular games is handball with special J.L.B. rules, and here again the two teams in the arena are representative of the London Battalion

GYMNASTICS AND AGILITY

COMPERE...None of the work that you have seen would be possible without good instructors. Here now boys show what can be done with practice and good coaching, and the instructors show the standard they are aiming at. This is the first time we have mentioned coaching; the lads throughout the Brigade are given the best training possible and all credit must be given to the Brigade's instructors.

RETREAT

COMPERE... The day starts with reveille - the day's work has been done, it ends with the sounding of retreat.

THE FINAL ASSEMBLY

COMPERE...We have taken you through six years of the life of a boy, and sixty years in the life of the Brigade. The boy has received his training, has learnt to command, accepted rank and responsibility. He, in turn has been able to put back into the Brigade some of his knowledge and enthusiasm. His bearing and sense of confidence is characteristic of leadership; his quiet good behaviour, the hallmark of a decently brought up lad. He is a worthy citizen and therin lies the strength of the Jewish Lads Brigade, stronger today than ever before.
