**DOMINICI TRIAL (Drummonds' murder case)**  
Positive developed: 94 meters - 304 ft  
also covered by all competition.

The trial in the Tribunal of DIGNE, of the old farmer Gaston DOMINICI who is indicted for killing Sir Jack DRUMMOND, his wife and clubbing to death their 10-year-old daughter Elizabeth in August 1952, began yesterday.

Sir Jack DRUMMOND a teacher in biochemistry at London University before the war was to get the Nobel Prize the same year he was killed when he was camping with his family on a side road near the DOMINICI farm called "LA GRAND TERRE". After a long and difficult inquest led by Inspector Sebeille, the two Dominici sons Gustave and Clovis admitted they knew their father, the old farmer Gaston (71) was the murderer. Gaston himself when under arrest, and in the course of the last two years admitted nine times that he murdered Sir Jack, Lady Drummond and their daughter.

To-day in the opening of his trial he repeatedly claimed that he is innocent.

International press and photographers came to DIGNE for this trial. However as the Justice court is extremely small, not all could find room inside, and no newsreel could enter the court room, officially. Our picture therefore shows the following :
