WHO ELSE COVERED ALL

Andrei Vishinsky's body was lying in state at the Soviet Delegation's Headquarters in New York city. This was the building where he had died of a heart attack some 24 hours before. The building was 680 Park Avenue in the very heart of the very fashionable district of New York. Newsreel pictures of the body lying in state were absolutely forbidden, although the public was admitted during various times of the day. Among the visitors were many members of the UN. At 5:00 PM New York time the body was removed to a funeral hearse. The pall bearers had quite a problem moving the casket. The casket of copper and wood was extremely heavy required 10 pall bearers to move it. It's cost was \$4,000.00

The funeral procession of close to 70 cars threaded its way to New York International Airport through the rush hour traffic, where Vishinsky's body was placed aboard an FAA plane for transport to Moscow.
