Keith Miller joins Morris. Stathen, off-balance, fails to take a hard return. Might have been a chance. Miller is seen in his stride and showing the style that's shattered English keeps so often in the past. Typen gets his ration of Miller punishment,

Bailey to Hiller, and there's a few more runs to swell the Aussies score to 601 for 8 declared. Particularly new that Compten's out of action, that's an almost insurmountable target for the toiling, hard-pressed Englishmen.
