FOUR DIE IN SUB DISASTER:

The submarine Talent lies in the River Medway after being swept from its dry dock at Chatham. A caisson serving as a dock gate gave way and was holed by the submarine bows. The back wash hurtled Talent out into the river. The wave, caused by the water rushing into the dock, swept four men to their deaths. This is a dock with its caisson in place. On the left is the collapsed dock where H.M.S. Talent was undergoing repairs.

Several of the 31 dock workers who suffered injury were working inside the Submarine when the disaster occurred. Tugs and launches sped to their rescue through the thick fog that hung over the river. A board of enquiry has begun discussions about the tragedy. Officials say that sabotage can not be ruled out.
