Acres of land in the Pederation of Malaya are under water following some of the worst flooding in years. The monsoon struck with terrential force. Within one hour, two and a half inches of rain fell in Singapore. Johane and Megri Sembilan have suffered even worse dompours. River and streams, swellen with the rain, have smashed scores of bridges along their course. Roads and railways have been out causing delay in reaching the stricken towns. Nevertheless rescue work has been swift, and within a few days more than 20,000 people have been evacuated to safety.

Loss of preperty and feedstuffs has been heavy. Shopheepers co-operate in attempts to save their goeds and to hurry them to fleed victims. Thousands have to be fed; but thanks to the immediate appeals made by the Governments of the States and Settlements, large quantities of elething, food and maney have been collected. Until the fleeds have receded completely, it is impossible to estimate the full extent of the damage, though it is certain to run into many thousands of pounds.
