Samy McCarthy gots himself in trim for his fight with Billy Kelly for the British and Empire Featherweight title. In a gymnasium over a pub in the Old Kent Read, Snewey Buckingham, his trainer, watches Smiling Samy tune up for the battle which Bob Gardiner is presenting at the King's Hall, Belfast, on January the 22nd. McCarthy, who hails from Stepney will have a tough opponent in Kelly, a Lendonderry boy, but experts predict Samy will heep his Featherweight erown.
