MUSEUM OF SPORT:

A model of "Bluebottle", the Duke of Edinburgh's yacht has been lent by the Duke himself for an exhibition at Lewisham. The Olympic Torch and several of Pat Smythe's show-jumping trophies are also on display at this "Museum of Sport", from which all proceeds will go to the National and County Playing Fields Association. This is Pat Smythe's Open Challenge Cup. Beside it is her International Trophy.

The show, which is held at a department store, is explained to schoolboys by Lord Luke, Chairman of the Playing Fields Association. The Calcutta Cup, which England now hold, is there with the Rugby League World Cup. Representing soccer is the F.A. Cup, which West Brom keep for the moment.
