Jimmy Wilde, the King of the Plyweights, watches Dower (who's been tipped to wear the same grown), show his superiority over Loch. The German is a substitute for Prenchman Mouginet and seems hardly in Dower's elass, though he's get more than his ration of pluck,

Bai Bower, the Empire Flyweight Champ, forces the pase almost all the way through the first two rounds. The fight is presented by Sydney Evans who gave Dower his first professional chance some years ago.

Dower seems mighty confident as he gets set for round three, and well he might, for Koch has been far from happy in face of the Welshman's cool attacks.

Half-way through the third round now, and Dower fires a right that sends Koch reeling. Two more hard rights send him down to the canvas. He won't be up for a long time.

The Welshman, who says he hoped the fight would go the full ten rounds, has won by a clear knock-out. Dai Dower, who is certainly one of Britain's best bezing hopes, will soon challenge Eric Marsdon for for British Plyweight Title.
