

10 RESCUE IN ATLANTIC GALE.

The Newfoundland Fishing Vessel "Student Prince the Second" is caught and crippled by an Atlantic gale 180 mile North-East of Bermuda. The liner "Queen of Bermuda" races through twenty foot high waves to the rescue. Acting swiftly upon an S.O.S. message, the liner is guided to the scene by Coastguard planes which circle the stricken ship.

Oil is spread about the Student Prince to calm the seas as a lifeboat puts out from the liner. All ten of the fishing boat's crew are quickly taken off, and the lifeboat, manned by volunteers, starts back. The liner is prevented from collision with the Student Prince as the lifeboat (in danger of being smashed against the liner's sides) unloads its passengers through an open port near the water-line.

Of the volunteers who manned the lifeboat, their captain says:
"They were darn good".
