A tense and dramatic rescue at sea snathhes from death the orew of a Newfoundland fishing boat. Caught and crippled by an angry Atlantic storm, its decks are awash - its lifeboats splintered. The liner Queen of Bermuda -- racing through twenty foot high waves, lashed by fifty withwax mile an hour gales -- is guided to the helpless craft -- two hundred miles northeast of Bermuda -- by Coast Guard planes which had circled overhead for twelve hours. A tiny lifeboat from the liner -- manned by volumteers -- bobs wildly in the mountainous seas as it rescues the fishing boat's ten crewmen and starts back. Skillful seamanship prevents the Queen from knifing into the sinking vessel as the lifeboat -- in danger of being smashed against the huge liner -- unloads its passengers through an open hatch near the water line.
