assist rescus from the sea. Lieutenant Communder Spreule, the inventor, fixes a net to a navel belieopter. The net can be learned from the aircraft, to scoop up a floating body. Taking the controls himself, the Lieutenant Commander gets ready to show how it works. It was whilst serving as commander of a search and rescue unit that he devised the net. After many experiments in his spare time he finally achieved success. Second Officer Leta Ridley of the Wrons is a volunteer for a practice run. At about twenty or thirty feet, the helicopter flies slewly in ready to secop her up as in a shrimping net.

The net, which is known to operate even in waves of about five feet, will soon be standard equipment for all naval belieppters.
