NAVAL ATACHES AT STOCKPORT WORKS

Naval attaches from ten N.A.T.O. and Commonwealth countries will visit a Stockport, Cheshire, factory on Tuesday, January 25th. They will be accompanied by the Director of Electrical Engineering of the Admiralty and representatives of the Engineer-in-Chief of the Fleet.

As a result, Commonwealth and foreign navies may decide to buy British diesel engines for their warships and dockyards.

The factory is that of Mirrlees, Bickerton and Day, Ltd. It is now completing a fight million Admiralty order for 261 diesel engines for coastal minesweepers. The naval attaches will inspect the production and testing of these engines.

The equipment at Mirrlees is claimed to be the most modern in the world. Mirrlees is the only factory producing 75 ton diesel engines by full flow production methods.

The present success of the company owes much to the visits to America in 1945 and 1950 of its 47-year-old managing director, Mr. Charles F. Barnard. On a three months' tour of the United States last year, Mr. Barnard found that Mirrlees was well ahead of its merican counterparts in the production of these larger types of engines.
