**BOBSLED**

**4-man WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP**

Frans KAPUS a Swiss Chauffeur, nosed out his compatriot Fritz Feierabend by three-hundredth of a second today to win the Four-man world bobsled championship.

KAPUS and his crew of three whipped over the perilous one-mile Olympic bob run here four times in 5:10.52 to defeat Feierabend and his team, holders of the 1934 four-man title.

Feierabend and his brakeman Harry Warburton won the two-man title last week so all world titles are now in Swiss hands. Feierabend's time for the four-heats was 5:10.55. Although he failed to win the big prize Feierabend flipped his sled over the course in the third heat to make the fastest time for one heat in the four-man competition.

Frans Schelle, Germany driving the Nr.2 sled finished third in 5:15.23 followed by an Austrian sled driven by Earl Wagner in fourth place, Wagner's time was 5:14.47

Another German team with Hans Roesch as driver, came in fifth. Dick SEVERINO of Saratoga Springs NY. driving the only United States sled in the race—after a spectacular spill yesterday eliminated the second American sled, finished sixth. Severino had with him in today's race T/Sgt Jack Culliton, Capt. Thomas Morgan and Airman 1st class William Williams. They will go to Lake Placid NU early next month for the Olympic tryouts.
