days to reach the aircraft. Helicopters were unable to land owing to
treacherous winds and driving snow. The second pilet of the airliner
was a married Londoner. It has since been revealed that diamonds, worth
several hundred thousand pounds, were ob board, All have been recovered
from the wreckage.
