FINS FOR OCEAN "QUEEN"

The Queen Elizabeth undergoes a much and brush up in a dry-dock at Southempton. With anchor chains weighing 300 tens, and the three anchors themselves at sixteen tons spices, it's obviously a major undertaking.

Down at the other end they're some pretty weighty problems too - four 32 ton propellors are to be given the once-over.

The annual overhaul is an even bigger task this year for stabilising machinery is being fitted. Four compartments have been constructed in the hull. From these will project the stabiliser fine, A crane lowers one into place. The whole operation (the largest of its kind ever undertaken) is costing about a quarter of a million pounds. These fine are capable of desping even the beavious roll at sea. A fifteen degree roll would soon be reduced to only two degrees. The Queen Elizabeth will shortly go to sea and be made to roll heavily to test the efficiency of her newly-fitted fine.
