THE QUEEN WORE A NEW AND STRIKING FLAME COLOURED SILK DRESS WITH A SQUARE NECKLINE AND ELBOW LENGTH SLEEVES WHEN SHE HELD AN INVESTITURE IN THE WHITE AND GOLD STATE BALLROOM AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE THIS MORNING.

ABOUT 200 MEN AND WOMEN RECEIVED THE INSIGNIA OF THEIR HONOURS AND AWARDS FROM THE QUEEN.

THEY WERE HEADED BY AIR MARSHAL SIR CLIFFORD SANDERSON, FORMERLY COMMANDER IN CHIEF FAR EAST AIR FORCE, WHOM THE QUEEN INVESTED WITH THE K.B.E.

AMONG THOSE RECEIVING THE C.B.E. WAS MR ALFRED HURLL, EXECUTIVE COMMISSIONER OF THE BOY SCOUTS' ASSOCIATION, AND THE CHIEF CONSTABLE OF DUNBARTONSHIRE, MR ARTHUR MCINTOSH.

COMMANDER CHARLES NOCK WAS GIVEN THE O.B.E. (MILITARY) FOR SERVICES IN CONNECTION WITH THE ROYAL NAVAL MINE WATCHING SERVICE.

MR ARTHUR HARTSHORNE, PRINCIPAL SCIENTIFIC OFFICER OF THE ROYAL AIRCRAFT ESTABLISHMENT FARNBOROUGH, RECEIVED THE O.B.E., CIVIL AS ALSO DID MR CECIL HEAR, GENERAL SECRETARY OF THE WALL-RAPER WORKERS' UNION AND MR HUGH KELLY, GENERAL SECRETARY OF THE PLUMBING TRADES UNION.

A NUMBER OF SERVICEMEN RECEIVED AWARDS FOR GALLANTRY IN MALAYA AND KOREA.

FIVE MEMBERS OF THE RECENT BRITISH NORTH GREENLAND EXPEDITION WERE GIVEN THE POLAR MEDAL.
