YORK CITY v. NEWCASTLE.

REPLAY.

York City take the field at Roker Park, Sunderland, for their second semi-final crack at Newcastle. 58,000 watch York kick-off. Last time the two teams met it was a one-all draw, a fair result to a close contest. York's right-wing is away, determined to make no doubt about the verdict this time, but goalie Simpson dashes their hopes for the moment.

Nothing comes York's way by half-time, so with the score still one-nil, play resumes with York, (perhaps a little tired by now) doing their darndest to crack the Magpie's defence. A bitter blow for York comes when their centre-half, Stewart, slashes with Keeble. Both are hurt, but Stewart will be off the most of the remaining time.

Only minutes to go. Newcastle try for another, but York, with only ten fit men, hang on grimly. They may be a Third Division Team, but they certainly play first division football.

One minute to go and Mitchell centres. Keeble is there to breast the ball home! A surprise goal that makes it two-nil. Newcastle, who've already won two Cup Finals since the war, will meet Manchester City in the 1955 Final at Wembley.
