INDIAN TRIBESIEN RETURN HOME.

The silent, ravaged ruins of a thousand year old fort overlook the tiny Indian village of Chittergraph. When it was captured by invaders four hundred years ago, the tribesmen left the fort - vowing never to return until it was free.

Teday, four thousand descendents of the liberty lowing men are coming back. Led by Premier Mehru, they are ending four centuries of self-imposed exile and endless wandering.

Passing through the arch into the sprawling, twelvesquare mile grounds, the tribesmen come with the assurance that their fort is free.

Oriental music provides a native background for the return of the wanderers. It is a day of achievement for Premier Nehru, a day of hemocening for a proud people.
