## THE CUP FINAL.

The right half promptly sends it on to Revie again but now the Newcastle defence have closed in and the raid fails as Simpson gets it and clears.

For a while Newcastle get well on top and Trautmann has to leap for it.

Now he has to dive for it: Trautmann owes his place in British football to the fact that he came here as a P.O.W. He's certainly playing a great game today!

A sudden reverse and the City get the ball upfield to the delight of their fans, but Johnson delays his shot and Simpson gets there.

The 10 men press and Hayes crosses for Johnson's equaliser. There was no delay in that flying header. He certainly made amends for his loss at that open goal. One each at half time.

City are in trouble in the second half - with Trautmann leaping to it again!

When they do got the play, the City show the effect of a man off. The well-drilled Newcastle defence have little trouble in sending Scoular away with it again.

While Trautmann gets ready, white centres and the wer dangerous Mitchell whips in to receive. He runs it on and scores from an almost impossible angle!

So Newcastle have the lead again - two one.

A ply they're playing a depleted team, for Newcastle are showing up very well. Stekee passes to Casey who carries on working it up-field as the Newcastle forwards sweep down on the City goal.

on the attack the Newsastle forwards find those open spaces. Mitchell shows superb ball control as he manoeuvres into position. His play is worthy of Matthews himself as he prepares for his shot at goal. Fingertips deflect it, but Hannah crashes it home!

Three one! In a match like this, that could be a decisive lead. It was Hannah's goal but Mitchell made it possible.

As lo men Arsenal did three years ago, the City fight back. Casey colliding with Revie, is injured and he's on the ground as the battle for the ball goes on - but he revovers later.

Back in the City half, Mitchell is on the ball again. Critics call him the man of the match. He centres but Trautmann runs out and collects - a levely piece of anticipation.

Still Newcastle and just before the end a last shot at goal has Trautmann diving - but it goes wide.

In the hands of the Queen - "The Cup" - the most coveted trophy of them all - as Socular leads his 3-1 winners up to the Royal Box. A great moment for the Newcastle fans:

As Secular said afterwards, the Newcastle team were proud to have won, but sympathised with Manchester in losing one of their players. In return, City captain Paul said "We were unlucky, but the better team won"
